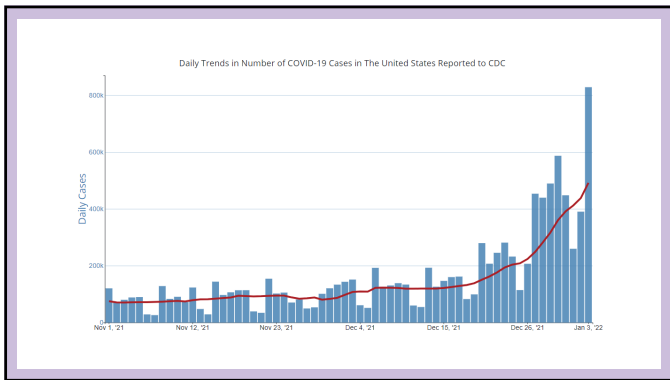

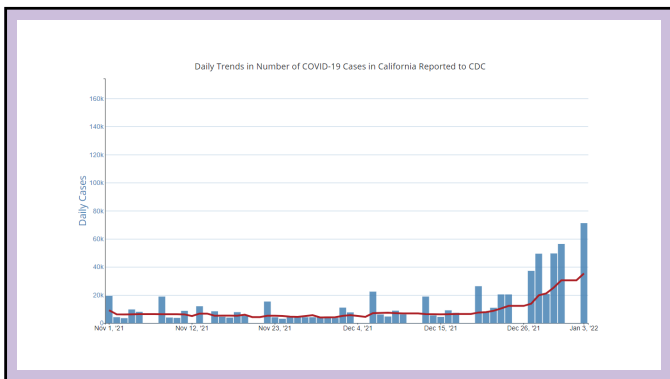

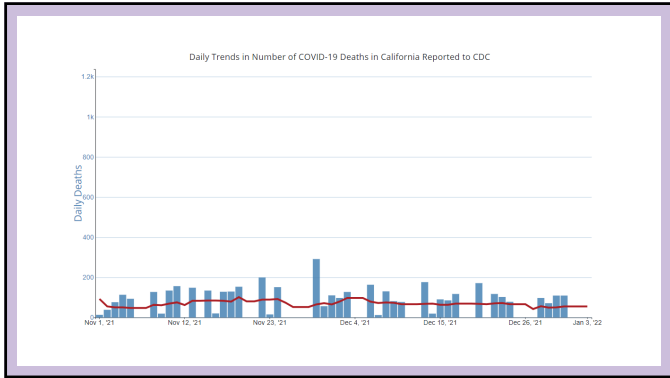

<b>18x ↓</b>	Severe disease in age 60+
<b>90% ↓</b>	Mortality

## Booster Recommendations

Manufacturer	When to Get a Booster
Pfizer	<b>5 months</b> after completing primary series
Moderna	<b>6 months</b> after completing primary series
J&J	<b>2 months</b> after receiving vaccination

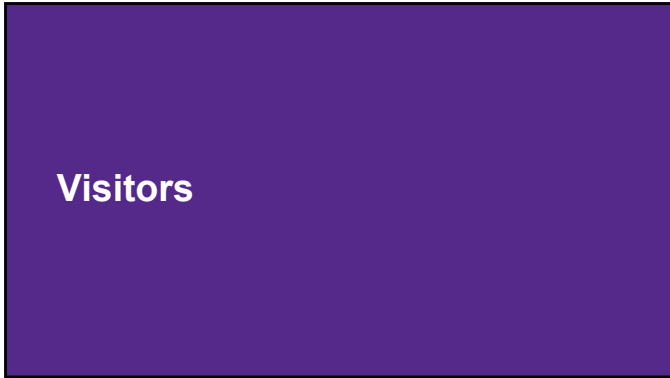

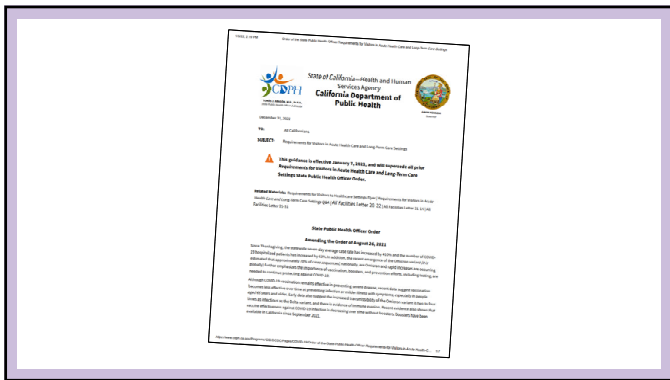

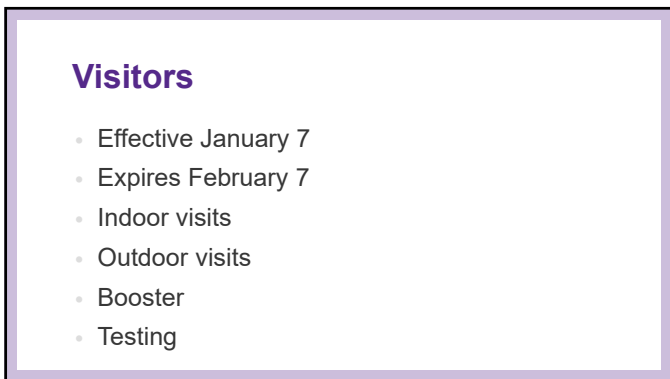

### Indoor Visits

- Must be boosted (if eligible), **AND**
- Must be tested
- Antigen within 1 day, or PCR within two days of visit)

### Outdoor Visits

- Must be tested
- Antigen within 1 day, or PCR within two days of visit)

### Exemptions

“If a resident is not able to leave their room or otherwise meet with visitors outdoors, the visitation may take place indoors, even for visitors who cannot provide vaccine verification or a negative test; however, these visits cannot take place in common areas, or in the resident’s room if the roommate is present...”

### Other Exemptions

- End of life situations
- “Support persons” for a person with physical disability or cognitive impairment

### Frequent Visitors

- Visiting on “consecutive days”
- Proof of negative test is required every third day
- Day 1, 4, 7, etc.

- Vaccine status
- Booster status
- Test results

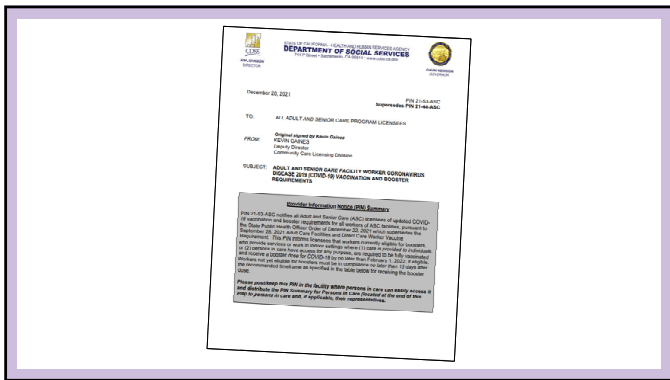

- Must receive a booster
- By February 1
- Or within 15 days of becoming eligible after February 1
- Test weekly until then

### Exemptions

- Religious belief
- Qualifying Medical Reason (must be documented by licensed medical professional)
- Test weekly

### Document

- Full name and date of birth
- Vaccine manufacturer
- Date of vaccine administration
- All doses, including booster

### “Worker”

- Paid and unpaid individuals
- Working in indoor settings
- Where care is provided
- Or where residents have access

### This Includes

- Contractual staff not employed by the community
- Clerical, clergy, security, etc.
- Dietary, environmental services, laundry
- Volunteers

### Does Not Include

- Construction workers (if no resident contact)
